### Minutes

**Meeting held on November 1, 1994  
Great River Office**

- 1.) Approval of Minutes from the October 11, 1994 Advisory Committee Meeting

***A motion was made by Dr. Koppelman and seconded by Joseph Colao to approve the minutes from the October 11, 1994 Advisory Committee Meeting. The motion was carried unanimously.***

- 2.) Progress Report and Report of Commission Actions

Mr. Corwin discussed the current applications pending. There was a hearing on Wednesday, October 26, 1994, and there will be another hearing on Wednesday, November 2, 1994. Mr. Corwin discussed the properties which are on the agenda for the November 2 hearing.

The Harriman school's draft of their final report is to be completed within the next few weeks.

The Trails working group has completed their final report.

The Hunting and Fishing group will have their report completed within two weeks.

The Protected Lands Council will have another meeting in two weeks.

The Cultural and Archaeological group continues to meet. It will take approximately another month or so before they produce their proposed addition to the Plan.

The Editorial Board has met twice so far, and they have reviewed many of the written comments which have been mailed in. There are approximately 300 comments which have been received.

- 3.) Committee Reports

- a) TDR - Mr. Tim Hopkins reports that there are many issues which must be discussed by the Commission, and until those issues are discussed,

there are no new developments to report.

- b) Ecology - John Black discussed the Ecology Committee's recommendations. The Ecology Committee has made specific recommendations on the placement of trails. Specific recommendations regarding the composition of the fire council will be made as well. Management strategies will be completed by late November, early December.
- c) Land Management - Marilyn England stated that at the last Land Management Committee meeting, their planning goals and planning recommendations were discussed. The report should be complete within a few days.
- d) Public Outreach - Donna Plunkett distributed a memorandum into each Advisory Committee member's packet. This memo reviewed the upcoming community design workshop in Riverhead. A summary report will be prepared for each of the workshop study areas.
- e) GEIS - Judy Jakobsen reported that the Editorial Board has met, and has reviewed the comments received. Mr. Corwin discussed the current status with regard to the GEIS.
- f) Economic Analysis - Mr. Corwin stated that the proposed final plan should be complete within a few weeks.

#### 4.) New Business

Dr. Koppelman stated that he is concerned with the mechanism with regard to comments which have been submitted by the Advisory Committee. Dr. Koppelman feels that the Advisory Committee should be in a position to reach a consensus among themselves regarding the generation of policy formulation.

A discussion then ensued regarding the prioritization of land in the Plan. Mike Deering stated that this topic should be placed on the agenda for discussion at the next Advisory Committee meeting.

Pursuant to a memorandum written by Carole Swick, the Town of Brookhaven is still working on the findings for North Shore Properties. We will be advised as soon as the findings are completed.
