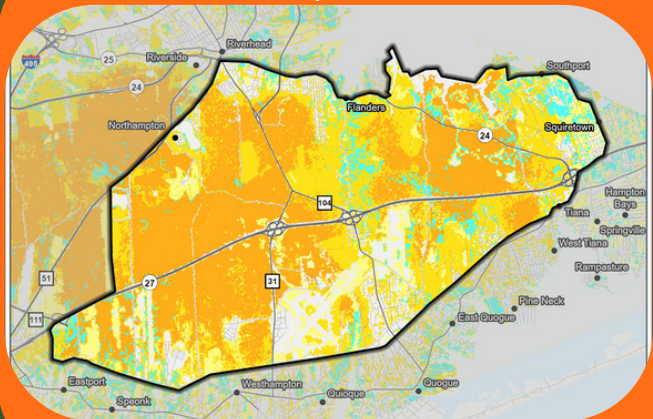


What is a CWPP?

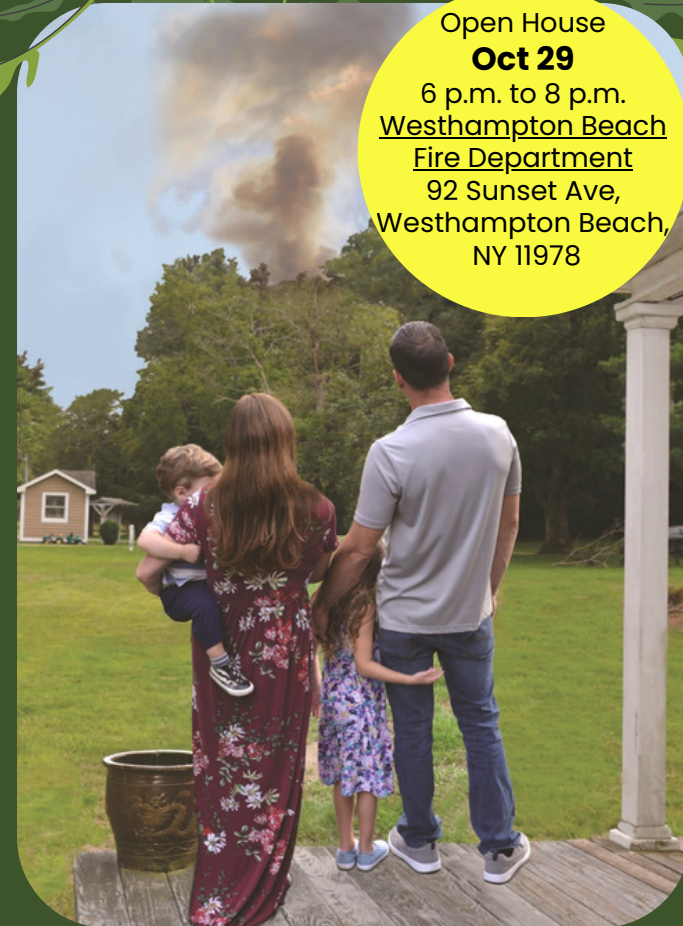

Southampton Community Wildfire Protection Plan



Southampton Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP) unites local stakeholders to address shared concerns regarding public safety, community sustainability and natural resources. It fosters a constructive, solution-focused atmosphere for tackling challenges, including enhancing local firefighting capabilities and establishing defensible spaces around homes and subdivisions, determining priorities for land management in your community.

CWPP Benefits

CORE TEAM

Strategic stakeholder and community partnerships facilitate effective collaboration for land management, stewardship, and landscape-scale wildfire mitigation.

PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT

Incorporating residents' perceptions about wildfire risk and mitigation efforts into the planning process is critical for community buy-in and effective implementation. CWPPs provide educational opportunities and make space for community feedback.

DATA GATHERING AND WILDFIRE HAZARD RISK ASSESSMENT

Fuels hazards, fire behavior, fire history, fire ignition risk, and infrastructure vulnerability are analyzed to assign risk categories to landscape and wildland-urban interface communities.

MITIGATION STRATEGIES AND ACTIONS

Develop an action plan with feasible recommendations for fuel and structural ignitability treatments that align with the National Cohesive Fire Management Strategy and identify stakeholders who are responsible for implementing mitigation solutions.



Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPPs) go beyond documenting wildfire risks by enabling proactive measures to enhance resilience through collaboration and effective planning.

Key benefits include:

Risk Reduction: Tailored mitigation planning based on local conditions.

Access to Funding: Eligibility for local fire departments to access grant funds.

Community Capacity & Collaboration: Building trust among residents, fire professionals and land managers.

Resilience & Readiness: Promoting public awareness and preparedness through engagement and planning.

Strategic Alignment: Aligning priorities among various partners to enhance resource effectiveness.

Inclusive Planning: Reflecting local values and community needs.
