# COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

<p align="center"><b>S-130/190 – 5 Day</b></p> <p align="center"><b>Firefighting Training/Intro to Wildland Fire Behavior</b></p> <p>Introductory course designed to train entry-level firefighters, Fire-fighter Type 2 (FFT2). Course covers basic incident management organization, firefighting techniques, suppression equipment, safety, strategy/tactics along with fire behavior. Field exercises will be performed for valuable hands-on training. Includes L-180.</p> <p><i>*No Charge to <u>Nassau/Suffolk Volunteer</u> Firefighters</i></p> <p><b>Prerequisite(s):</b> None</p>	<p align="center"><b>S-130/190 Field Days Only</b></p> <p align="center"><b>Firefighting Training/Intro to Wildland Fire Behavior (Field Days Only)</b></p> <p>This course is for individuals who have taken S-130/190 online. Students must submit proof upon arrival to the academy that they have completed the online portion of this class. Click on the following link to access S-130, S-190 &amp; L-180 online courses:</p> <p><i>*No Charge to <u>Nassau/Suffolk Volunteer</u> Firefighters</i></p> <p><b>Prerequisite(s):</b> S-130/190 Online course <span style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 2px;"><i>*Flat Fee Class</i></span></p>
<p align="center"><b>S-131</b></p> <p align="center"><b>Firefighter Type 1</b></p> <p>This course is designed to meet the needs of an Advanced Firefighter Type 1 (FFT1). Course is interactive and contains several tactical decision games designed to facilitate learning. Topics include: fireline reference materials, communications and tactical decision making.</p> <p><b>Prerequisite(s):</b> Qualified as FFT2</p>	<p align="center"><b>S-211</b></p> <p align="center"><b>Portable Pumps and Water Use</b></p> <p>This course gives students practical knowledge and application skills in portable pump operations. Field exercises will train students in the setup and operation of a portable pump along with foam applications. Presentation to include pros and cons of retardant use.</p> <p><b>Prerequisite(s):</b> None</p>
<p align="center"><b>S-212</b></p> <p align="center"><b>Wildland Fire Chainsaws</b></p> <p>The course lessons provide introduction to the function, maintenance and use of internal combustion engine powered chainsaws, and their tactical wildland fire application. Field exercises support entry level training for firefighters with little or no previous experience in operating a chainsaw, providing hands-on cutting experience in surroundings similar to fireline situations.</p> <p><b>Prerequisite(s):</b> Qualified as FFT2 <span style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 2px;"><i>*Flat Fee Class</i></span></p>	<p align="center"><b>S-215</b></p> <p align="center"><b>Fire Operations in the Wildland/ Urban Interface</b></p> <p>This course is designed to assist initial attack incident commanders and company officers in confronting wildland fires that threaten life, property and improvements. Course is also suitable for volunteer firefighters who have leadership roles in fire companies that respond to wildland fires.</p> <p><i>*No Charge to <u>Nassau/Suffolk Volunteer</u> Firefighters</i></p> <p><b>Prerequisite(s):</b> FFT1 qualified. Must be knowledgeable of agency's firefighting policy relating to wildland/urban interface fires.</p>
<p align="center"><b>S-219</b></p> <p align="center"><b>Firing Operations</b></p> <p>Identify the roles/responsibilities of the Firing Boss (FIRB) for planning, execution, safety, coordination and evaluation of ignition operations on a wildland or prescribed fire. Describe/demonstrate the applications of various firing devices. Students will prepare a firing plan and briefing that discusses fire behavior, firing techniques, resource requirements, coordination, safety and risk factors to meet specific objectives.</p> <p><b>Prerequisite(s):</b> Qualified as a FFT2 <span style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 2px;"><i>*Flat Fee Class</i></span></p>	<p align="center"><b>S-200</b></p> <p align="center"><b>Initial Attack Incident Commander</b></p> <p>This course is designed to meet the training needs of the incident commander type 4 (<u>ICT4</u>). It is presented in a discussion/exercise format. The six instructional units include Foundation Skills; Intelligence Gathering and Documentation; Size Up the Incident; Develop a Plan of Action; Post-fire Activities; Evaluating Incident Objectives and Manage the Incident. Evaluation of the student is by unit tests and performance based evaluations.</p> <p><b>Prerequisite(s):</b> Qualified as any single resource boss. Satisfactory completion of pre-course work</p>

# COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

<b>S-230</b> <b>Crew Boss (Single Resource)</b> <p>This course is designed to meet the training needs of a single resource crew boss on an incident from initial dispatch through return to home unit. Units include preparation, mobilization, tactics and safety, off line duties, demobilization and post-incident responsibilities.</p> <p><b>Prerequisite(s):</b> S-131 &amp; S-290; FFT1 qualified</p>	<b>S-231</b> <b>Engine Boss (Single Resource)</b> <p>This course provides single resource boss training relevant to the engine boss position. Units covered include: identifying crew and engine capabilities, gathering information for assignments, communicating and coordinating effectively with crew members, and tactics and safety.</p> <p><b>Prerequisite(s):</b> S-230; FFT1 qualified</p>
<b>S-236</b> <b>Heavy Equipment Boss (Single Resource)</b> <p>This course objectives include: identify and demonstrate the heavy equipment inspection process and related duties of the HEQB, demonstrate the actions required of a heavy equipment boss to safely and effectively complete an assignment, discuss relevant information and methods for communication and tactics related to heavy equipment, and identify the process of preparing for an all hazard assignment.</p> <p><b>Prerequisite(s):</b> FFT1 qualified; Satisfactory completion of pre-course work.</p>	<b>S-359</b> <b>Medical Unit Leader</b> <p>This course is designed to provide the skills and knowledge needed to perform in the role of Medical Unit Leader (MEDL). Topics include gathering information, organizing the medical unit, supervising the unit, evaluation, documentation, and demobilization.</p> <p><b>Prerequisite(s):</b> Current certification as Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) or equivalent.</p>
<b>ATV</b> <b>All-Terrain Vehicle and Driving Operations</b> <p>This course is given by the All-Terrain Vehicle Safety Institute Course is a hands-on ATV course that involves field practice such as starting and stopping (both gradual and quick), negotiating hills, emergency stopping and swerving and riding over obstacles. Course covers protective gear, environmental concerns and local laws. Course discusses the specific safety issues associated with using ATV in wildland firefighting situation. Course will satisfy the requirements for ATV skills on wildland firefighter's Red Cards.</p> <p><i>*Students Must bring own ATV to the class.</i></p> <p><b>Prerequisite(s):</b> None</p>	<b>UTV</b> <b>Off-Highway Vehicle Basic Driver Course</b> <p>This course is designed for off-highway vehicle users involved in wildland firefighting and emergency response scenarios. This course is conducted by certified driver coaches. Course is a partial-day program that has approximately three hours of riding time that includes between-exercise discussions. Course includes six closed range exercises and up to seven optional open trail experiences, depending on terrain that is available. Course is given by the Recreational Off-Highway Vehicle Association (ROHVA) and will satisfy the requirements for Utility Task Vehicle (UTV) skills on wildland firefighter's Red Cards.</p> <p><i>*Students Must bring own OHV to the class.</i></p> <p><b>Prerequisite:</b> ROHVA E-Course: This two-hour safety course helps develop safe driving habits, but it is not a "learn to drive" course. E-Course focuses on: Key risk factors associated with ROV operation; Safe driving practices that will reduce risk of injury; the best resources for learning about your particular vehicle.</p>
<b>FI-210</b> <b>Wildland Fire Origin &amp; Cause Determination</b> <p>The primary purpose of this course is to provide a consistent knowledge and skill base for the Wildland Fire Investigator (INVF). The concepts taught in this course will help an INVF perform at an acceptable level on a national basis without regard to geographic boundaries.</p> <p><b>Prerequisite(s):</b> Completion of pre-selection assessment and pre-work.</p>
