Connetquot State Park Preserve

Part of the Long Island Greenbelt Trail (white blazes)

About 50 miles of trails!

North side of NY 27, west of Exit 47

Lakeland County Park

Part of the Long Island Greenbelt Trail (white blazes), with a connection to Connetquot Park'

Also has boardwalks for views of swamp

Johnson Avenue between Old Nichol's and Terry Roads, Islandia

Sans Souci County Preserve

Four miles of trail and views of old cranberry lakes on Brown's River Broadway Avenue, ¼-mile south of NY 27, Sayville

Pine Trail Preserve

Part of the Paumanok Path (white blazes)

Hike southeast to Sandy and Grassy Ponds (4 mile round trip) NY 25, 0.6 miles east of William Floyd Parkway

Brookhaven Trail and Brookhaven State Park

Yellow-blazed trail extends 5.2 miles to connection with the Paumanok Path

Southwest corner of Shoreham-Wading River H.S. lot, NY 25A Or, for other trails, William Floyd Parkway entrance, opposite Whiskey Road

Manorville Hills County Park

Part of the Paumanok Path; includes short and long loop hiking trails, separate mountain bike and equestrian trails C.R. 111, south of L.I.E. Exit 70

Pine Barrens Trails Information Center

Short loop trail plus connections to the Paumanok Path Open seasonally on weekends, but trails are always open ¼ mile north of Exit 70, L.I.E.

Dwarf Pine Plains Interpretive Trail

Short loop trail, less than a mile

East side of C.R. 31, just south of NY 27 Exit 63

Quogue Wildlife Refuge

Excellent out-and-back and loop trails with wetlands, lowland pines and dwarf pines and live wildlife exhibit Old Country Road, Quogue, east of C.R. 104

Pleasure Drive Trailhead

Paumanok Path access (white blazes) to Maple Swamp, Birch Creek and Owl Pond

Bend in road at south end of Pleasure Drive, just north of Exit 64, NY 27

Spinney Road Trailhead

Short side trail (yellow blazes) accesses Paumanok Path (white blazes near Birch Creek

South side of NY 24, opposite Birch Creek Road, Flanders (Spinney is a closed, gated road.)

Birch Creek Road

Unmarked trails with connections to Hubbard County Park and views of Peconic Bay

End of dirt road, north of NY 24, Flanders

(Sandy; front-wheel or four-wheel drive recommended.)

Hubbard County Park

Unmarked trails lead to the Peconic Bay (closed early summer for osprey hatching)

Red Creek Road, north of NY 24, Flanders
